RIBEIRA



Older and more typical of the city of Porto, it is part of the Historic Center, a **UNESCO World Heritage Site**. Ideal for walking without haste, to enjoy the pleasant surprises you will find in every street and alleyway.

GAIA PIER



From the Gaia margin you get one of the best views of the city of Porto, an authentic illustrated postcard.

Here, on the banks of Gaia, you cannot miss one of the many famous **Port Wine Cellars**, which are historical and unique.

From the apartment go to Luis I Bridge, cross to the other bank.

CHURCHES



As Portugal is a country with a Jewish-Christian background, to understand our culture, a visit to our churches is fundamental.

Cathedral (Terreiro da Sé) - From the 12th century in the Romanesque style, suffered over time changes with the insertion of new Gothic and Baroque elements.

From the width of the Cathedral you can enjoy excellent views and we advise you to go down to the river through the narrow and characteristic streets and stairs

Church of San Francisco (Rua do Infante D. Henrique) - Gothic Church with Baroque interior with gold carving, built in the 14th century

Carmo Church and Carmelitas Church (Praça de Gomes Teixeira, 10) - Built in the 18th century, Carmo Church is Baroque with a façade in tile, Carmelitas is in the classic style

Church of Santa Clara (Largo 1º de Dezembro) - From the 15th century, its interior is one of the best examples of the art of the gilded carving of the Baroque Joanino. Enjoy the proximity and descend to the Ribeira by the stairs of the Guindais

Church of São João Novo (Largo São João Novo, 2) - From the 16th century

Grilos Church (Largo do Colégio) - Built by the Jesuits in the 16th century in Baroque-Jesuitic Mannerist style

On the outside you will have a breathtaking view of the Ribeira. You should take the time to climb up to the Cathedral via Pena Ventosa Street and delight in these charismatic streets

Church of São Martinho de Cedofeita (Priory Square, 72) - The oldest of Porto, the original one being built by the Suevos in the 4th century, being the present Romanesque Church dating from the 11th century

Church of the Misericórdia (Rua das Flores, 5) - Built in the 16th century in Renaissance style with Gothic reminiscences

Church of the Congregados (Praça Almeida Garrett) - Frontier in Baroque style of the 17th century, lined with tiles

CHURCH AND CLÉRIGOS TOWER



Iconic tower of the city, Baroque style designed by Nicolau Nasoni, with excellent view from its top after climbing 225 steps, all built in granite stone.
Enjoy and rest in the **gardens of the Praça de Lisboa** or **Jardim da Cordoaria** (Garden)

Cross the upper level and you will have a breathtaking view of Porto.
On the bank of VN Gaia, rest in the **Morro garden** or in the **Serra do Pilar Monastery**, which is right next door, to enjoy this breathtaking view of Porto, descending after in the cable car to visit the Port Wine cellars

FOZ – ATLANTIC OCEAN



Walk along the beach or take advantage of the numerous terraces where you can watch an extraordinary sunset.

Take the Tram to Foz, Line 1, which follows along the river. Take the tram near the São Francisco Church and get off at the end of the line in Jardim do Passeio Alegre.

Try the **Praia da Luz terrace** with its good atmosphere to relax, then you can diner at the traditional **A Capoeira** restaurant (Esplanada do Castelo, 63) or enjoy some snacks at **Casa de Pasto da Palmeira** (Rua do Passeio Alegre, 450)

FERNANDINA STONE WALL



It is the name by which the medieval belt of walls became known, from which only small parts survive to this day.

The Fernandina Wall replaced the old high-medieval fence that, in the 19th century, was too small because of the city's development. It was rebuilt by D. Fernando, who retained the name, between 1368 and 1437, with funds from wine tax "Sisa do Vinho" and had an extension of 3,000 steps and an average height of 30 feet.

FLÔR DO GÁS BOAT



Flor do Gás is a small boat used only to transport people (and bicycles) from one side of the Douro river (Lordelo do Ouro - Porto) to the other (Afurada - Vila Nova de Gaia), since 1961. It crosses the Douro River every 15 minutes, allowing you to enjoy a different perspective of the Arrábida bridge and also the view where the Douro River meets the Atlantic Ocean.

The boat has an outside deck, but as it can get windy, there is also space inside surrounded by windows so that this view is not missed. You can use this to have lunch on the other side of the river, because Afurada has good fish restaurants:

The traditional dish “Tripas à moda do Porto”



In order to supply the ships that left Porto for the conquest of Ceuta, in 1415 during the period of the Portuguese Discoveries, all the meat that the city had been cleaned, salted and bedridden in the boats, leaving the population sacrificed solely with the offal to feed, including the casings of animals.

It was with them that the Portuguese (people from Porto) had to invent food alternatives, thus appearing the dish "Tripas à moda do Porto", which would eventually become one of the most characteristic gastronomic elements of the city.

In such a way that, with him, the nickname "Tripeiros" was also born, as the inhabitants of Porto have been known since then.

The dish is made with various types of meat, casings, sausages and white beans.
